Bitches In Season May Run At This Trial

To be able to run a BIS, you must immediately tell the trial secretary, who will mark BIS on the running orders. Any BIS will run at the end of the class, regardless of height. If the dog is not wearing BIS pants, they will start on a mat provided by the show. It is the handler's responsibility to ensure the mat is available for their runs. The handler/owner acknowledges the inherent risk of running a dog on an agility course with BIS pants on and assumes all risk by doing so.



AKC Class Changes

♦ Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend – Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day

Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers With Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

♦ Fix and Go On (FNG)

Fix and Go On allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using Fix and Go On will result in a non-qualifying score. Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the run.

♦ Entering For Exhibition Only (FEO)

FEO allows exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. FEO is offered in all classes. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.

- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.

- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.

- Dogs may be entered in any level of FAST (Novice, Open, Excellent, Master). If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.

- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out. FEO may be declared earlier (ex. when checking in at the gate board).

- Toys are allowed in the ring. Toys must be non-audible and may not leave the handlers hand. Toys that roll freely may not be used.

- Food/treats are not allowed in the ring

- FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog and not as a punitive correction. Harsh verbal and /or physical corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.

- A judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time

Effective July 1, 2024, the fault call scored for an FEO run shall be changed from Excused ("E") to Absent ("ABS"). Scribes should continue to write "FEO" on the scribe sheet; however, the Score Table shall now enter that run as an Absent run.

In doing so, the Defeated Dogs report used by Breed Specialty clubs will no longer have FEO runs in their Number of Dogs Entered calculations nor will FEO runs affect calculations where Number of Dogs Competing are involved, such as calculating Premier Top 25% counts.

This change is for all classes: Standard, Jumpers With Weaves, FAST, Time-2-Beat, Premier Standard, Premier Jumpers, ISC Agility, ISC Jumping, ACT and ACT J.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR INTERNATIONAL SWEEPSTAKES CLASS (ISC)

Purpose: The International Sweepstakes Class (ISC) is a non-regular class providing the dog and handler an opportunity to demonstrate their advanced training and handling skills on various International Style Standard and Jumpers with Weaves courses. The rules for this class are generally based on international rules. The variety in International Agility course designs is very diverse, so handlers should be prepared to meet the "Challenge of the Day" when competing in the ISC class. The total challenge level may be easier, more difficult, or simply different from what is currently allowed in Excellent / Master Class. Complete rules for the ISC are available from the AKC Website (<https://www.akc.org>).

Eligibility: ISC classes are open to dogs that are eligible to compete in AKC agility trials. There is no Preferred Option for ISC; dogs may enter at their preferred jump height, however they will be scored against the regular division dogs jumping the same jump height.

Jump Heights: DOGS MAY BE ENTERED IN THEIR REGULAR JUMP HEIGHTS, however, only those dogs running in the 12", 16", 20" and 24" class that meet the FCI/ISC measuring cutoff (different than regular AKC cutoffs) may use their clean run toward the required qualification toward entering WTT or EOTT. Please see the 2026 EO/AWC Tryout Rules for further details.

The FCI/ISC cutoffs for those heights are as follows:

12" (Small) for dogs 13 ¾ inches and under at the withers

16" (Medium) for dogs over 13 ¾ inches and up to 16 7/8 inches at the withers

20" (Intermediate) for dogs over 16 7/8 inches but less than 18 7/8 inches at the withers

24" (Large) for dogs over 16.75 inches and under at the withers

2027 AKC/USA World Team Tryouts (WTT) Regional ISC Qualifier Events

The American Kennel Club is pleased to announce the Regional ISC Qualifier Events for the 2027 AKC/USA World Team Tryouts qualification period. These events have been selected to provide geographic balance and competitive opportunity across the country, and will serve as the designated qualification events for this cycle.

ISC Combined Class Winners

Combined scores from ISC Jumpers and Standard classes at the Regional World Team Qualifier Events will be used to award the Combined ISC Class Award. To be eligible, a team must have a minimum of one clean ISC run and one run with no more than five (5) course faults (no time faults permitted). Combined Class winners in the 12", 16", 20", and 24" height divisions are invited to attend Team Tryouts and are not required to fulfill the 4/4 score requirement. All required documentation, fees, and entry materials must be submitted and all standard eligibility requirements outlined in the WTT documentation must be met. The handler competing at Tryouts must be the same handler who earned the Combined Award. AKC has adopted a regional qualification model for the ISC program. For each qualification period, four Regional ISC Qualifier Events are selected nationwide. The events listed below represent the designated qualifier events for the current qualification year.

- July 11–12, 2026 – Mudi Club of America – Northfield, CT
- October 31 – November 1, 2026 – Midwest International Agility Club (MIAC) – Middleton, WI
- January 22–24, 2027 – Dog Obedience Club of Hollywood – Punta Gorda, F

MEASURING and HEIGHT CARD INFORMATION

Dogs without a valid Jump Height Card must be measured/wicketed by the Judge of Record PRIOR to running in their class and this measurement will be valid for that weekend of trials only. The exception to this requirement is a dog entered in the 24" height division. As well, if a **Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO)** or an **AKC Agility Field Rep** is present **ALL** dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form must be measured at some time during the trial or cluster of trials. This does not preclude having the dog wicketed by the Judge of Record if the VMO or Rep is not available to measure the dog **before** its first run of the trial or cluster of trials. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running and failure to do so will result in the loss of any qualifying scores earned prior to being measured at that trial or cluster of trials.

Please indicate in the appropriate section on the entry form if your dog requires a measurement.

DOG ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age and older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Services (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Whenever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Dogs should be physically sound, Dogs that are blind shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive, dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. Puppies under four (4) months of age are strictly prohibited from the trial grounds.

OBSTACLES AND RING CONDITIONS

The equipment will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the AKC Regulations for Agility Trials. Clip N Go dogwalk, aframe, and teeter will be used. Ring size 120' X 70'. The trial is indoors on dirt. The building is not climate controlled. Tire will be set at FCI heights for 12", 16", 20" and 24" jump heights.

No entry shall be made or accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance. Illegible or incomplete entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor.

Return checks do not constitute a valid entry and a \$25 collection fee will be charged for returned checks.

Preliminary confirmations will be sent when the entry is processed. A **Final confirmation** will be sent after the trial closing. Please read ALL email correspondence carefully for accuracy.

If necessary, a **waitlist** will be maintained for one (1) week after the trial closing date. A refund will be given to an exhibitor pulling from the trial after closing if the runs can be filled from the waitlist.

A few days before the trial a **Judging Schedule** will be emailed. The running order and Judging Schedule will be posted to the Secretary website at www.awesomedogsagility.com.

You may enter this trial online using LabTestedOnline.com. During the first 48 hours after opening, the initial limit of entries designated as either online or paper will be as follows, 30% online and 70% paper. If either form of entry has not filled at the end of the 48 hour period, the club reserves the right to increase or decrease either one accordingly.

COURSE WALK-THROUGHS AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only. Handlers with multiple dogs, at events with multiple rings, may request to walk with a height group other than the one their dog is entered in if a conflict is imminent.

A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, may be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training or relieving of the dog.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR, and LIABILITY

The **safety of the dog** is of primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. **RACE** and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property, and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. **RACE** reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog that exhibits aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against **RACE** or any official thereof. **All dogs must be on leash** at all times when on trial grounds except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course.

REFUNDS

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee.

To be able to run a BIS, you must immediately tell the trial secretary, who will mark BIS on the running orders. Any BIS will run at the end of the class, regardless of height. If the dog is not wearing BIS pants, they will start on a mat provided by the show. It is the handler's responsibility to ensure the mat is available for their runs. RINGSIDE

Dogs may arrive any time prior to judging if the dog has a valid temporary or permanent jump height card. Otherwise, if a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner/Handler is solely responsible for having the dog ready at ringside when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility for providing service through public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought to the ring when required.

Handlers whose dogs measure into the 8" through 20" regular jump height divisions may opt to enter in a higher or 24-choice height division for all Regular titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs who measure into the 24" regular jump height division may not enter 24-choice. Dogs entered in the Preferred classes must compete at the required jump height and may not compete in a jump height division higher or lower than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an **Agility Jump Height Card** may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or *back-to-back trials* only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the **AKC Canine Partners ProgramSM** may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.

Junior Handlers should enter their Junior Handler number on the front of this form. Should you not have your Junior Handler number, it may be obtained from the American Kennel Club (919) 233-9767. If the Junior Handler is not the owner of the dog identified on the face of this form, what is the relationship of the Junior Handler to the Owner?
